Summary of Investment Objective



Fund Manager Comment

Market environment

MENA equities, represented by the S&P Pan Arab Composite Large Midcap index gained 2.84% in the reporting month. Relative to global markets, Mena equities underperformed the MSCI World by 1.11%. Global equities resumed its uptrend as prospects for continued earnings growth outweighed concerns on trade tariffs by the new US administration. US equity market gained 3.24%. Emerging market equities gained 2.70% buoyed by Chinese equities. Commodity complex represented by the Bloomberg Commodity Index gained 4.02%.

Portfolio performance

The fund underperformed its benchmark primarily due to selection effects. The fund lost relative performance from stock selection effect in UAE market. While in Morocco, the fund lost relative performance due to allocation effects. From a sectoral perspective, the biggest contributors to relative performance was Industrials and Telecoms. While Consumer Discretionary, Consumer Staples and Healthcare were negative contributors to relative performance.

Outlook

Mena equity markets have underperformed global equity market peers in the 2024 due to increased geopolitical risk, higher interest rates and weakening global commodity prices. Global commodity prices influenced by slowing global demand outlook and increased supply following the normalization of supply chains. Crude oil prices remained range bound most of 2024 as OPEC+ kept market well supplied to meet demand. Mena market fundamentals are undemanding with earnings growth at lower single digit growth. Improvement in the geopolitical situation is key to unlock investor confidence to commit capital that could spur corporate earnings growth.
